



## נ א NUN ALEPH

נ – **NOON** –or **NUN** stands for FISH darting in water. It is the 14<sup>th</sup> letter with a value of 50, and represents freedom and life in the fullest..Let's look at what the number 14 represents. Deliverance or salvation. The 14<sup>th</sup> day of the first month is the Passover..when G-d **delivered** the firstborn of Israel from **מָוֶת** mavet death. Some 430 years earlier, on the night of the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the first month, G-d made two covenant promises to Abraham...one of the physical seed, Isaac, and his descendants, and one of the spiritual seed, **יֵשׁוּעַ** Yeshua, and the sons of G-d who would come through Him, who would shine like the stars of heaven . Matt 13:43 says...:THEN THE RIGHTEOUS WILL SHINE FORTH AS THE SUN IN THE KINGDOM OF THEIR FATHER, HE WHO HAS EARS, LET HIM HEAR.” On the day portion of the 14<sup>th</sup>, G-d confirmed the promises with a special covenant sacrifice.. as stated in Genesis 15:1-11. On the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the first month, the Passover day in 30AD, **יֵשׁוּעַ** Yeshua, G-d manifested in the flesh, the only begotten Son of G-d the Father, and the Lamb of G-d to take away the sin of the world, was crucified as the perfect sacrifice to save mankind from sin. Yeshua's death on Passover completed His ministry in the flesh. Seven is the number of completion...thus  $7 + 7 = 14$ , indicating a **double** completion: 1/His ministry in the flesh was completed; and 2/ His sacrifice ended or fulfilled the need for animal sacrifices. All of this refers to life.

Interestingly, in the Biblical days, a person did not achieve wisdom until he reached the age of 50.

Pertinent to the number 50, we can see that the 50<sup>th</sup> year is the jubilee, the year of release and redemption. Fifty is also connected with the coming of the **רוּחַ הַקֹּדֶשׁ** Holy Spirit. **יֵשׁוּעַ** Yeshua ascended to **שָׁמַיִם**.. heaven for the first time, to be accepted by the Father as the first of the first fruits. Beginning with that day, there is a 50-day count to Pentecost, the Feast of First fruits, when the **רוּחַ הַקֹּדֶשׁ** Holy Spirit was first poured out upon the Church....the first fruits of the spiritual harvest. G-d the Father did not send the Holy Spirit until **יֵשׁוּעַ** Yeshua, as the new High Priest, placed His blood on the altar of atonement....representing the day of being 'born again' from flesh to spirit...representing new **חַיִּים** LIFE.

To get better acquainted with this letter **נ**, let's put it in some words. We will deal with other words later on as well.

נוש is pronounced, 'noosh' and it means to 'be sick or distressed. Also it can mean to be 'full of heaviness'.

Now let's break it down. We recognize the two letters that we have, or are currently studying, the ו vav, which represents, or symbolizes אדם 'man' because of the numerical value of '6' which is the number of אדם man, and the letter we are now studying, the letter נ which represents 'life'. The letter ש sheen, we have discussed many times in class, but have not explored in detail yet, represents, in this word, 'teeth' or 'destroy'. So, as we dissect this word, נוש noosh, here is what we get. 'destroying the life out of אדם man'.

Vowel points are so important. Here is a prime example.

נשם.."nasham" means 'to blow away', to 'destroy', or 'breathe heavily. Let's look at this word closely.

The נ nun, as we now know is the symbolism for 'life'...the ש sheen represents, in this word and context, 'teeth' or 'destroy'. The final ם mem sofit is 'water' or 'chaos'. So, here is a picture of a situation that's not desirable in our life. We can also change the meaning of the letter ם mem sofit to mean 'the water of the word'...which in this case would mean that the 'Word of G-d is being destroyed, thereby destroying 'life'.

Taking the same word and changing the vowel points, we see a completely different picture. נשמ...nashem means 'inspiration'. It also means 'life in the name' Do you see that?

I hate this word....נחש 'nachash'. This word means 'snake'. Lets look at it closely....not too close however....we don't want to get bit.....

Since we have studied the first two letters, and know the meaning of the last, we should be able to figure out how this word relates to 'snake'. Let me help....life is fenced in and destroyed. Do you see it?. Let's move on.

Look at the word 'Amen' אמן. ם is first....מ water of the Word....ן ..life. so, amen really means from G-d, we get the 'Word' to get 'life'. 'So be it' We agree with what G-d has said.

נשמה...n'shamah, a word we will deal with later in more detail, is the word for 'soul'. Permit me to take us a little deeper. The soul, or נשמה...n'shamah is a Heavenly spark housed in an earthly container, called our body. A 'no brainer' there. However, attached to that body, the soul is dependent and restrained, like the bent shape of the letter we are studying, the נ nun. Released by death, or מות

mavet,, the נשמה...n'shamah, soul, returns to its original home, where it rises....like the straight י...nun sofit...to its full stature.

Let me tell you a story about a King. He had a garden...גן..gan.. with delicious figs. The King put two watchmen at its gate, one blind, the other lame. After a time the lame man said, 'I see some fine figs, but I cannot walk.' The blind man answered, 'But I cannot see.' So the lame man got on the shoulders of the blind man who carried him to the tree, from which he plucked the ripe fruit. In this manner, they were able to eat the figs.

When the King came and asked, 'Where are the figs?' The bond man answered, 'Can I see?' and the lame man said, 'Can I walk?' The King set the lame man on the blind man's shoulder and said, 'Together you have managed to eat the figs. Together you shall stand trial.'

Similarly, when we mean the L-rd in the world to come...when the soul says, 'I have not sinned, ...the body has sinned, for since I have come out of the body I am like an innocent bird....and the body replies...'I have not sinned, it is the soul which sinned, for from the hour that the soul has left me I lie like a stone upon the ground. What does G-d do?...He cast the soul back into the body and judges the two together.

We need to relate this to what we are doing while on this earth, going through life....there is no hiding from G-d on what we do with our life....we must take all the blame on ourselves,....whether it be our soul or our body that is in a 'trespass' state.

I will end this lesson with this thought....Since the י nun represents a 'fish darting about in the water representing life', think about this. If a person does not deserve blessing, or is in sin and is enjoying the sin nature that his body and soul are experiencing, his fate is similar to that of a small fish, which become prey to the larger fishes.....oh oh....
